The minutes of the regular meeting held July 5, 2022, were read by Vice-chairman Jerry Haar and approved on a motion made by DJ Greenhill and seconded by Jerry Haar . **Motion** carried.

Cemetery: (Sexton's report)

- 1. Deed #664 issued; Transfer deed #665 issued
- 2. Sexton made aware of a \$2,500 grant from the Licensing and Ohio Cemetery Dispute Resolution Cemetery Grant Program with an August 1, 2022, application deadline. After discussion on possible uses, J. Haar moved and Greenhill seconded that an application be submitted and if awarded the grant would be used to repair old monuments and foundations in Union Cemetery. **Motion carried**.
- 3. The lawn mower that had been back ordered since spring arrived at the dealership. The original plan was to upgrade and replace a current mower. However, the delay caused more hours to be put on the mower to be traded in, which reduced the trade-in allowance. The cost of new mowers has increased and availability is an issue. Additionally, the sexton expressed concern about possible breakdowns leaving only one mower to maintain the good order of cemetery grounds. Having a third mower would reduce the buildup of hours on each mower and would extend the longevity of each machine. This purchase required approval of a supplemental appropriation to Fund 2041, Line item 2041-760-740-0000 Machinery/Equipment for the 3rd mower purchase of \$10,879.00. J. Haar motioned and Greenhill seconded to add a 3rd mower to the cemetery fleet at a cost of \$10,879, approve the supplemental appropriation to Fund 2041, and issue a purchase order to Bill's Implement Sales. Motion carried.

Roads: (Road Superintendent's report)

- 1. The road salt bid was awarded to Morton Salt (same vendor as last year) for \$53.63/ton. Twenty-five tons were ordered for the upcoming season.
- Trustees will review road resurfacing projects. Witty Rd and Opfer Lentz being considered for possible OPWC grant funding. Other roads discussed during the 2022 road tour included repairs to Weis, Yeasting and Slemmer. Applications for Issue II (OPWC) are due to the Engineer's office by September 9th for projects being planned for 2024.

EMS/Fire: (Chief's report)

- 1. Trustees entered into an "automatic" mutual aid agreement with Portage Township which avoids delays in response times.
- 2. Three additional 800 MHz radios are out of service. Replacements will not be ordered, as MARCS radios are on order.
- 3. One more helmet must be ordered for an EMS Officer/Medic who needs it when reporting to fire emergencies.
- 4. Christa Watson and Mariah Mariano have been recommended for hire as part-time EMT's pending background and driving record checks. Trustees approved.
- 5. Greenhill motioned and J. Haar seconded appropriating money from the general fund for an employee assistance program for 2022 and the issuance of a purchase order to Memorial Professional Services Ltd/ProMedica EAP for annual material fee of \$500 and \$100/month for (50) employee service plan. **Motion carried.**

Building & Grounds: (Jim Wilburn, building supervisor) — no report

- 1. Carroll Township will host the quarterly meeting of Ottawa County Trustees on July 28, 2022.
- 2. Commissioner Douglas offered to discuss any concerns or questions regarding Ohio Senate Bill 52 regarding large wind farms and solar projects in townships in Ottawa

County. A resolution restricting and/or prohibiting constructing such facilities in Harris Township was moved by Greenhill and seconded by J. Haar. **Motion carried**. (See resolution attached)
