The minutes of the regular meeting held July 18, 2022, were read by Chairman Beverly Haar. DJ Greenhill moved and Jerry Haar seconded that the minutes be approved. **Motion carried.**

FINANCIAL

A motion was made by Jerry Haar and seconded by DJ Greenhill that the attached list of bills totaling \$31,891.62 be approved as the lawful obligations of Harris Township and that the Fiscal Officer be permitted to issue warrants in favor of the same. **Motion carried.**

REPORTS

Financial/Administrative: (Fiscal Officer's report)

- 1. Trustees reviewed invoices, signed checks/vouchers, reviewed/initialed payroll, and reviewed/signed purchase authorizations.
- 2. The second half of the real estate assessment of \$346,821 has been received.
- 3. Research needs to be done on OneOhio Opioid litigation before any action can be taken.

Zoning: (Inspector's report)

- 1. Seventeen permits have been issued thus far in 2022.
- 2. Zoning permit #720 issued to Dawn Hicks and Bridget Scherf, 776 S SR 590 for pool.
- 3. The boards working on the zoning resolution will not meet until the corrections have been completed and can be reviewed. The Commission has sent the proposed changes to Mesa at Ottawa County Zoning for review.
- 4. Zoning Board of Appeals will be meeting 8/25 at 7 pm to review variance request for Hawn accessory building (size).

Cemetery: (Sexton's report)

- 1. The grant application requesting monument and foundation repairs in Union Cemetery has been sent in.
- 2. Deed #650 has been reissued.

Roads: (Road Superintendent's report)

- 1. Ron Street is experiencing flooding in his crawl space. He has already contacted the county engineers and is requesting township approval to insert a hard pipe under Smith Road to drain his property. Work contracted with Down Under Plumbing. Trustees had no objection but reminded him to extend the pipe so bank erosion does not take place.
- 2. Supt. Johnson will contact the county engineer's office for estimates on resurfacing Witty Road from Opfer Lentz to SR 51 and Martin Williston to see if they may qualify for Issue II funding. Application is due September 9.
- 3. The second round of mowing along township roads has begun.
- 4. Southeastern was contacted about the throttle sticking on the front-end loader.
- 5. Verbal agreement with Jerry Hetrick confirmed for the purchase of his dirt for \$1,000 for the Portage River Rd culver liner project.
- 6. Signage requested for hidden drive on Portage River South Rd.

Fire: (Chief's report)

- 1. ID numbers for reflective residence address signs need to be ordered.
- 2. Lt. Dan Dewyre has signed up for the fire instructor's class at Vanguard.
- 3. Asst. Chief Berkel is working with Cleveland Communications on contested invoices for repair of headsets.

EMS: (Assistant EMS Chief's report)

- The power cot ordered for the new ambulance is being replaced by a new version. The current version will be obsolete in two years. Fortunately, the old and new versions will be compatible with squad design. B. Haar moved and Greenhill seconded that the new version be ordered at an increased cost of \$6,570. Motion carried.
- 2. Discussions about EMS coverage for the township have been on-going for several years. COVID's effect on burn-out and reduction of medical professionals is not only occurring in hospitals and nursing homes but also in hiring EMT's. Pay increases as incentives have strained the township budget and are ineffective because larger companies/cities are attracting EMT's, leaving Harris Township unable to compete. Our trustees and medical staffing want to continue dedicated, local, timely responses for our residents. It has become necessary to resolve the issue by hiring full time EMS employees to augment part time staff. This requires competitive pay and benefits including health insurance which is costly. The current levy is already stretched and becoming inadequate. Therefore, the renewal of the current 4.5 mill levy and an additional 4 mill levy to meet the projected costs will be necessary. See attached levy resolution of necessity.

WHEREAS, the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten mill limitation vibe insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of said Harris Township, Ottawa County, Ohio;

Therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the Board of Township Trustees of Harris Township, Ottawa Count two thirds of all members elected thereto concurring, that it is necessary to levy a tax the ten-mill limitation for benefit of Harris Township, Ottawa County for the purpose

providing ambulance service, emergency medical service, or both, under Ohio Revised Code Section 5705.19 (U)

A <u>renewal</u> of a rate of four <u>and one-half (4.5) mills</u> and an increase of four (4) mills to constitute a tax rate not exceeding eight and one-half (8.5) mills for each one dollar or valuation, which amounts to eighty-five cents (\$0.85) for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for a term of five years commencing in the tax year 2023, to be collected in calendar year 2024.
